Albert Carl Smith peacefully departed this life on Wednesday, July 11, 2012 at Raritan Bay Medical Center in Old Bridge, New Jersey at the age of 79. He was predeceased by his son, Carl Zabriskey; his two sisters, Dorothea “Dottie” Stalks and Roberta “Ro” Watson and two brothers, Clarence “Smitty” Smith and Oliver “Ollie” Smith.
