Mary Royal (Currin) Peeples was born December 8, 1912 to Thomas R. Currin and Rosa Wilkerson Currin, an only girl, along with three brothers: Edward T., Robert I., and Rev. Charles C. Currin-all deceased. At age twelve she was baptized at The First Baptist Church Oxford, N.C. where she sang in the Junior choir and taught Sunday School.

She graduated from Mary Potter Memorial High School in 1932. In 1934, she was a student at Virginia Union University in Richmond, VA. She came to New York City in 1936, and was married to William H. Peeples-now deceased, in 1937. This union was blessed with three children: William, Gwendolyn and Douglas.

Mary Royal joined the Church of the Master in the 1940's with the encouragement of Rev. James Robinson and Rev. Richard Stenthouse. She became "Teacher of the Year," later becoming Superintendent of the Junior Department. In 1964 Mary Royal was ordained a deacon by Rev. Eugene Callender and served more than three terms. She also served in the Women's Presbytery as circle leader of zone 2c.

For twenty-five years she was employed at the Saks Fifth Avenue Department Store.
