## *Obituary*

In her earlier years, she was a member of the Jamaica Agricultural Society and also the Federation of Women. She owned and operated a thriving dress shop in Kingston for a period of time. She was ordained an evangelist by Bishop S.E. Bailey, in Rehoboth Pentecostal Church Kingston Jamaica where she was an active worker and a strong supporter of her pastor Mother Mary Elizabeth Bailey. Her firm belief in God set her on a high level of prayer and fasting. She was always praying for the sick, shut in, demon possessed and the needy. She was very charitable to various organizations that needed help in the United States. She will be remembered for her profound knowledge of the Bible, her teaching, preaching, cooking and feeling of the hungry. She enjoyed politics.

Olive migrated to the United States of America after her children were grown. She worked with some outstanding people namely: Mrs. Joan Tully Exxon Executive, Eugene Leahy - Dentist, Dr. K. Mirsky Anestheologist, Attorney A. Silowsky, caring for their children and love ones. She filed for all her children to become, US citizens. During these years she labored in Mt. Zion Apostolic and Gospel Light Churches, Newark, NJ. Twenty nine years ago she founded the Rehoboth Deliverance Temple assembly. She allowed her daughter Beverley Williams to become the pastor and worked closely with her. She along with her pastor and saints paid for the church property. Mother will as she was favorably known worked tirelessly as Assistant Pastor, treasurer, Mother of the Rehoboth Deliverance Temple and the community of Vailburg Newark New Jersey. She loved good worship and a life of holiness.

In June 2004, she prayed to God for something special for the church, so she began to write inspirational poems as a fund raiser, she sold \$520 in five weeks. In 2006 she was inducted by **The International Society of Poets** and was awarded a beautiful trophy. In September 2008 her first book was published titled **“God’s Soul Food.”** May 5, 2008, Olive graduated from the Institute of Children Literature West Redding, Connecticut. In 2009 her second book of poems **“Poetic Dew Drops”** published. In 2010 she wrote her first religious play to be published. In the last six months of her life she painted and drew beautiful sceneries. Hail to this Matriarch, Mother of Zion, who had the strength and a determination next to none. She will be greatly missed, & cherished forever by all. She has touched the lives of so many. She will be greatly missed by her spiritual children in Rehoboth. She is now resting in the arms of Jesus her Lord and Savior a place of quiet rest.

She was preceded in death by her husband, Victor George Williams, sons, Michael and Errol Williams.

She is survived by: her sons, Carlton and Raouel; daughters; Beverley, Janet and Grace; adopted daughter, Katherine; fifteen grandchildren and fifteen great-grandchildren, sister, Adina Adassa; nieces, daughters and son-in-law.
