**Edward Fairfield Generals, Sr.**, was born December 21, 1926 in Hackensack, New Jersey to the late Harold Generals and Alice (Daniels) Generals

Edward attended the Passaic school system, where he maintained his home until illness required him to reside with his son.

Edward received Christ as his savior at an early age. He was baptized under Rev. Dr. T. H. Alexander, Pastor of the Union Baptist Church in Passaic at that time. He was a faithful member for over seventy-five years and retired Trustee Emeritus under the late Pastor, Rev. Dr. Ronald Johnson. He served in various ministries throughout the years, including the Building Committee, the Male Chorus and Trustee Chairman. His favorite scripture was Psalm 23, and his favorite song was "Total Praise".

Edward was a World War II Army Veteran, enlisting May 28, 1945 and serving in the Quartermaster Corps. After four years of service he was honorably discharged. Edward was a lifetime member of VFW Post 10117, and also a member of the American Legion.

During his enlistment Edward married the late Virginia (Glover) Generals. From this union two children were born; Marlene Generals Doggett (deceased) and Edward F. Generals, Jr. Edward later married the late Jeanette "Terry" Generals.

Edward worked for Raybestos Manhatten Rubber Company for 35 years and Tenneco Chemical Company for 10 years. He was also a Security Sergeant at Harcourt Publishing Company.

Edward was an accomplished professional drummer playing with the band "The Swinging Kings." He was also an avid bowler, participating in industrial and church leagues. His other hobbies included listening to Jazz, collecting 45's and 33's. He was an amateur photographer and always kept his camera on hand. He accumulated thousands of photos chronicling almost every aspect of his life. Whenever there was a family gathering he took pictures. Edward was fashion conscious and mindful of his appearance.

He was predeceased by his brother William Generals.

Edward entered into eternal rest July 18, 2012 at his son's home in Williamstown, NJ.

He leaves to cherish his memory his son Edward Jr., whom he called "Bubby" (Deborah, whom he called "Doll") of Williamstown, NJ, a sister Dorthea Generals McCrea of Patterson, NJ, two brothers, Donald (Donnie) Generals of Passaic, NJ and Daniel Generals of Patterson, NJ, four grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren and a host of nieces, nephews and cousins.
