Marion Elizabeth Langley, was born on May 20, 1922 in Lynchburg, Virginia, the second of two daughters born to the late Robert Claison Anderson and Elva Janet Walker Anderson. Marion attended the Lynchburg Public School system and graduated from Dunbar High School. While living in Lynchburg, she was also a member of Rivermont Baptist Church.

On September 27, 1941, Marion married her childhood sweetheart, Lloyd L. Langley. After her husband's service in the United States Navy, they moved from Lynchburg to Bronx, New York where they became members of St. Paul's Episcopal Church. Two daughters were born from this union: Brenda Jeanette and Evonne Charisse. In 1958, the family moved to their new home in Westbury, Long Island, New York.

Marion was employed as a Sales Department Manager at Gimbels Department Store in Garden City, New York for over twenty years, retiring in the 1980s. She also sold Avon products from her home in the 1950s and 1960s.

She was a member of the Order of Eastern Star, Past Matron of Ashlar Chapter #71.

Marion and Lloyd were inseparable, doing almost everything together. They enjoyed attending the annual class reunions in Lynchburg, Virginia, dancing, traveling, and vacationing at the Jersey Shore. In later years, the couple became members of Westbury Community Church and also sang in the choir.

She was a loving wife, mother, grandmother, aunt, cousin and a trustworthy friend. She had a positive attitude, a great sense of humor and a beautiful smile. She was willing to help others in a quiet manner, and most importantly, she loved the Lord.

For decades Marion hosted many Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners that the entire family looked forward to with great anticipation. She was also a great seamstress. You could often hear her humming or singing a tune while sewing, cooking or doing daily chores.

The Langley's were residents at the Bristal Assisted Living in Westbury from May 2011 to July 2012. In August of 2012, they transitioned to the Brighton Gardens Assisted Living/Skilled Nursing facility in Edison, New Jersey.

Marion was predeceased by her sister, Ruby Lee Anderson.

On October 4, 2012, Marion Elizabeth Langley was called home to be with the Lord at the tender of age of ninety.
