Claudia purchased several properties during her time in New York but chose to raise her family in the home in Cambria Heights. This home had one of her most prized possessions, a beautiful garden which even on a cold day, Claudia could be caught tending.

Always a kind and giving person, Claudia will be remembered as a woman who passed along all the opportunities and blessings that came her way. She is credited among countless people as someone who was a loving, supportive and gentle spirit.
