<u>The Obituary of Alease Oliver</u>

Alease Oliver was born November 10, 1929 in Amelia, Virginia. She was the youngest of five children born to Wilson and Lou Carey. All of her siblings preceded her in death. She graduated from Amelia's School system and attended Virginia State College. She accepted Christ at an early age joining what is now known as the Zion Hill Presbyterian Church in Amelia, Virginia.

In 1949, Alease was united in marriage to Joseph Oliver who preceded her in death. This union produced three children; Marilyn, Joanne and Anthony (Tony). Alease was between New York and Amelia after marriage; however, she migrated to New York after the birth of her second daughter. Her two young daughters were left in the care of her parents while their father's grandparents lived a short distance away. She remained in New York until her death.

Alease worked in the hospitality industry as a housekeeper. While living on 139th Street in Harlem; she often attended Abyssinian's evening services because of her schedule. After moving to Dyckman Housing; she later joined Mount Washington Presbyterian Church where she was an Elder. She enjoyed participating in Biblical as well as special occasion readings, assisting in preparation of the bulletin board and setting up for Communion.

Emotionally independent, Alease never liked to infringe on others for assistance but she did enjoy eating other folks cooking especially desserts. Her children, her Church and her community were her life. Daily walks were part of her routine along with completing challenging crossword puzzles in the local newspapers. She also enjoyed shows such as Jeopardy and Cash Cab that challenged her thinking.

Alease passed this life on December 18, 2012. She leaves to mourn: her three children, Marilyn, Joanne (Gerald deceased) and Anthony (April); two granddaughters, Kimberly and Natasha; two greatchildren, Tre'Jour and Nadir; nieces, nephews; and a host of friends.
