Darlene Brendalee Brown Moose was born January 7, 1945 in Egg Harbor, NJ, the daughter of the late Alice Teagle Brown and Charles Brown. The family moved to Linden, NJ where Darlene attended public school and graduated from Linden High School in 1963.

Darlene was a member of the 500 Voices of Deliverance Choir and was a first row soprano singer.
