Obituary

William was born in Bamberg, South Carolina to the late Sammie and Jessie Branch on November 22nd 1937. He was the eldest son of eight children born from this union. William attended Elementary School in South Carolina. After moving to New York in 1947, he went to Intermediate School and later attended Franklin K. Lane high School in Brooklyn, New York. William had inherent abilities in mechanics, plumbing, electrical work and technology and also earned a number of certificates from schools through-out the 5 boroughs.

William met the love of his life and on June 27th, 1959, he was joined in Holy Matrimony to Deaconess Ocie Branch. From that union four children were born. They were blessed beyond riches and were married for fifty-three years. William was the husband and father that every family dreams of and the type of man often depicted in novels about the great men of history. He believed that a true man was supposed to work hard, provide for his family, build a stable foundation and always walk with strength and dignity.

William started his career at Singer during his late teenage years and worked in machinery for over twenty years before the business moved to North Carolina. Afterwards, he began a career at Trans World Airlines (TWA) in operations and maintenance where he worked for over twenty-five years until his retirement. William also took on a part time position at Morning Star as the church custodian in 1965. He took pride in making sure the sanctuary and physical appearance of the church was well kept at all times. If you ever needed to locate William, you knew that he could always be found somewhere on the church grounds, regardless of the day or hour. He labored there for over forty-five years and only retired due to health issues.

William accepted Christ at an early age at Holy Trinity Baptist Church in Brooklyn, New York. He later moved to Queens and joined Morning Star Missionary Baptist Church in Jamaica where he retained his membership until he passed.

William was a faithful member of Morning Star and became an ordained deacon on July 30th, 1967 under Reverend Harvey E. Pasley. He was blessed to have served under Reverend Charles E.
