Later she began a fellowship with the congregation of Love of Jesus, under the pastorate of Jason Alvarez, where she remained a faithful member until her passing serving as a Greeter, a member of the Usher Board, and worked on the Follow-Up Committee. In October 2012, Frances was ordained as an Elder.
