

<u>Obituary</u>

Reverend Roosevelt Whitted departed for his reward on Wednesday, January 2, 2013. His vision of victory in Christ was never dimmed by the reality of the struggle.

Roosevelt was born in Raeford, North Carolina to Martha Jane McCall and the late Theodore Whitted on January 19, 1945.

Roosevelt graduated from Eastside High School in Newark, NJ in 1963. Roosevelt attended North Central University; formally known as North Central Bible College. It was at North Central where he met the love of his life, Willa. Roosevelt and Willa were joined in holy matrimony on May 24, 1969. To this union were born the late Roosevelt David, Esther Donzell and Willette Deltriess.

Roosevelt and Willa were both ordained in the ministry in July 1970. Working hand in hand with his wife, Roosevelt served as the Pastor of Bethel Soul Saving Station in Newark, NJ. In fact, it was at Bethel Soul Saving Station, under the leadership of Mother Marshall, that Roosevelt came to know the Lord for himself and accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as his personal Savior. In addition to his pastoral role, Roosevelt served with his wife as the Sunday School Superintendent at Soul Saving Station Headquarters, NY.

Roosevelt's academic achievements include the following: Master of Theology, American School of Divinity (Manhattan Bible Institute); M.S.W. Rutgers University; M.P.S. Pastoral Counseling, New York Theological Seminary; Postgraduate Center for Mental Health, Blanton Peale Institute of Religion & Health; Theological Studies, Zion Bible Institute; Doctoral Studies, Assemblies of God Seminary.

As a result of "studying to show himself approved and able to rightly divide the word of truth," (2 Timothy 2) Roosevelt instructed in the Collegiate Bible Institute. He had a passion for teaching the word of God and therefore taught the word of God beyond the church walls of his home church, Soul Saving Station, Headquarters, New York. He did this by extending the course registration of the Collegiate Bible Institute to other churches. Those churches included: Gethsemane Soul Saving Station, Pastor Parrish & Wilma King, Rosedale, NY, Faith Revival Center, Hackensack, NJ, Pastor Reverend Marie Hayes, The Gospel of St. Luke Church, Bronx, NY, Pastor Josie Smith, Breath of Life Church, Bronx, NY, Pastor Aubrey Adams. Roosevelt would ultimately become the President of the Collegiate Bible Institute in 1985 with his goal being to create a Bible College. He led this ministry for over twenty years until his health began to fail.

Roosevelt also had a passion for singing. He diligently led Song Service, now known as Praise & Worship, every Sunday at the Soul Saving Station Headquarters in New York. After most of his sermons, he would sing this hymn. "But until then, my heart must go on singing, but until then, with joy I must go on, until that day, my eyes behold that city, until the day God calls me home."

If you knew Roosevelt, you knew of his kindness and humility. He had an infectious laugh that he applied to almost every situation. One day as we were leaving our home in New Jersey to travel to New York for church, and this was done every Sunday, we noticed that the car wasn't where my father parked it. We walked around to see if he might have parked the car in a different spot and just forgot that he parked it somewhere else, but still, we did not see it. So my dad looked at us and started laughing and said, "Someone must have borrowed our car and just forgot to bring it back." We took the bus and a couple of trains to church until we were blessed with another vehicle. That was Roosevelt, he was always able to pull the positive out of any given situation and just laugh.

Roosevelt leaves to cherish his precious memory: his mother, Martha Jane Whitted; two daughters, Esther (Edouard) and Willette; one son-in-law, Ronald Edouard; two grandchildren, Eric and Symphony; one step-brother; and a host of great aunts, great uncles, cousins, relatives, friends, and his loving church family of the Soul Saving Station.


