James Henry Curtis Jr. born the oldest child to the proud parents, the late James Henry Curtis Sr. and Evangelist Rosalee Johnson entered this world on October 9, 1947 in Newark, NJ.

Responding to the voice of the Almighty God, James suddenly yet peacefully, slipped into the master's arms on Tuesday, February 5, 2013, joining his parents who both preceded him in death.

After receiving his formal education from the Newark Public School District, James affectionately known as Curtis/Jr, joined the US Military, where he served as a corporal/specialist in the Army division. During his time in the military Curtis had been stationed at Fort Bragg, North Carolina and Fort Knox, Kentucky. His tours of duty included Vietnam and Japan. Curtis was given an honorable discharge having received the following decorations and medals: National Defense Service Ribbon, The Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Metal and Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal. He continued serving his country re-enlisting in the National Guard and the Army Reserve.

Prior to Curtis' enlistment with the US Military, he met and married his childhood friend and sweetheart Pauline Johnson on October 1, 1967. To this sacred union four children were born: James Anthony, Coretta Yolanda, Paul Matthew, and Michael Lamar. During his childhood years Curtis was a member of Heard A.M.E Church, Roselle, NJ., and later joined Gospel Mission Baptist Church, Newark., NJ., under the leadership of his father-in-law, the late Rev. Peter Johnson. He accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior and was baptized. Although quiet in nature Curtis enjoyed singing and playing the guitar and listening to music referred to as "The Golden Oldies". He enjoyed laughing with family and friends while also challenging their intellect with crossword puzzles, jeopardy and wheel of fortune. Prior to Curtis' health illness he enjoyed his many years of employment as a truck driver.

James Herny Curtis Jr.'s legacy will continue to live through cherished memories by his devoted wife, Pauline Curtis; daughter Coretta Yolanda, sons; James Anthony, Paul Matthew, (Hadassah), and Michael Lamar Curtis, nine grandchildren and two great grandchildren; his siblings, Gerald Washington, Elizabeth, NJ, Terrence Curtis, Albany, NY and Elder W. 
