<u>Obituary</u>

The legendary **Bruce Lee**, lived an extraordinary ninety-five years as a Veteran, Trend Setter and Family man. **Bruce**, son of Hattie Lee Filmore, was born January 20th, 1918 in Crestwell, North Carolina. **Bruce** Lee suddenly departed this life on Friday, April 19th, 2013.

Bruce lived in and attended high school in Newark, NJ.

Bruce served in the United States Army as a Utility Repairman in the 1940th Engineer Aviation Utility Company. He was awarded the Army of Occupation Medal, Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal, Good Conduct Medal and a World War II Victory Medal.

Bruce later lived in East Orange, New Jersey where he worked for Western Electric in Kearny for thirty-eight years. While there he met and joined in holy matrimony his beautiful wife, Carolyn, in 1963. They were wed at Bethany Baptist Church by the Minister James A. Scott.

Bruce was the definition of a hard worker. After retiring and relocating to Maplewood, NJ in 1981 Bruce still found time to landscape everyone's lawn possible on the block, give advise, teach the children and still be the best dressed at any function while making everyone laugh whenever possible.

Bruce leaves to cherish his memories: his loving and devoted wife of fifty years, Carolyn Lee; daughters, Deborah Thompson and Lynne Nelson and her fiance John Bennett; grandchildren, Tamara Thompson, Joslyn Smith, Dean Nelson, Tiffany Jones, Brook Jones, Lucille King, Elizabeth Al-Baseer, Regina Bolden, Eugene Banks and Darleen; thirty-one great grandchildren; five great-great grandchildren; and a host of family and friends.

Bruce was preceded in death by his mother, Hattie Lee Filmore, his aunt, Iclean Palin, his mother-in-law, Alberta V. Schench and three of his five children, Preston, Bruce Jr. and Verlena Jones.
