## Obituary

Alfred W. L. Payne Jr. was born December 7th, 1938 to Alfred W. L. Payne Sr. and Annie L. Payne in Bronx, NY. He was the younger of two children following his older sister, Beatrice O. Henry, who preceded him in death in July, 2004. Alfred was a product of the New York City Public School system. He attended Commerce High School where he studied music and played varsity basketball for three years. During his time there Alfred excelled in sports and enjoyed his musical instruction. His father wanted him to sing opera. His most memorable moment was the studying the musical play "The Student Prince" and song presentation of "I Will Walk with God" performed by Marie Lanza in 1954. He became a lover of Jazz music.

Upon graduation, still guided by his parents influence, he went on to college to further his studies. Majoring in Physical Education with minor interest in Petroleum Engineering, he continued to play basketball until he injured his knee during a game. Shortly afterwards Alfred joined the United States Army enlisting with the infantry as a heavy weapons specialist. During this time Alfred continued to express his love of the game of basketball through playing and upon completion of his tour served in the reserves before being honorably discharged from the service in October of 1965.

Later in his adult life, Alfred was a blessed and proud father of several children, Annetta, Kenneth, Rahsaan, Anthony and Alfred III. He was a passionate man, expecting much of them as he guided them toward adulthood. During these years in his walk with the Lord, he became an employee of the Sunshine Biscuit Company of New York and New Jersey. Poking fun at himself, he adopted the nickname "The Sunshine Flour Man". He then moved on to be employed with the Ideal Toy Company of New York before embarking on his career with the Metropolitan Transit Authority. He began as a porter with the Brooklyn Rail Division B.M.T. line, and progressed in his career becoming a bus driver. He began his driving career as a driver out of the Jackie Gleason (Ralph Cramden) depot of Brooklyn, NY and later moved on to the Jamaica Bus Depot where he settled and finished his career as a bus driver working his shift "The 9 on the 5" as a regular operator of the Q5 bus in Southern Queens, NY. While employed with the MTA, he continued to play basketball while befriending a multitude of people along the way.

Later in life, with prayer and careful deliberation, Alfred furthered his walk with the Lord becoming a member of the Diaconate Board of Majority Baptist Church in April of 2000. In the fall of 2000 he met his beloved wife, Cassandra Payne who he married in August of 2005. During this union he showed his loving care and concern for Arnetha, A.J., Abbey and Casey.
