## A Time To Be Born

**Sheryl Ann Hosier** was born in Harlem Hospital, New York City on June 23, 1950. She was the third of three children born to the late Wallace and Hermina Hosier. She was a premature baby that at birth weighed only 1 lb. 12 oz. and the family lovingly nicknamed "Peanut". Even at an early age, Sheryl's strong will and spirit helped her to overcome health obstacles and develop into a healthy child.

#### A Time To Live

Sheryl was reared and educated in the New York City. She received her elementary and secondary education in the New York City Public School System. She obtained her high school diploma from Brandeis High School and a nursing degree from Bronx Community College Nursing Program, also a Bachelor's Degree at Mercy College. For over 30 years, Sheryl worked as a registered nurse; finally retiring in 2008. Sheryl was an ardent believer and participant in the Black Awareness and Civil Rights Era of the 60's and 70's. She was very sincere and outspoken about human injustice. Sheryl loved to travel. Often, accompanied by her girlfriends, she took cruises; her favorite cruise was aboard the noted Queen Mary.

Family was important to Sheryl. Often, she orchestrated family celebrations and holiday dinners. Though her immediate family was small, consisting of her only child, daughter, Sasha and grandson, Jared; she expanded her nurturing to all her nieces, nephews, cousins and family members of her friends.

### A Time To Die

In early 2012, Sheryl's health began to decline and she required rehabilitation care; she was placed in the Isabella Geriatric Center. In November, Sheryl's health issues became more severe and she was admitted to Lenox Hill Hospital. On Tuesday, May 7, 2013, after a long and valiant fight, Sheryl succumbed to a multitude of health complications and departed this life. Sheryl was predeceased in death by her parents, Wallace and Hermina Hosier.
