Chuck legacy lives on through his children; daughters, Rena (deceased), Doreen, Charlene and Shanton; sons, Kevin, Curtis, R.D and Jaivon; grandchildren, Jerry, Jamar, Marcel and Dominique; He also leaves behind a host of aunts, uncles and cousins. Chuck loved his family and friends, many of whom he met while working at the health food store. He will be truly missed by everyone who knew and loved him.
