

Remembering Fred

Fredia Beisrel Dixon was born on March 1, 1939 in Neptune, New Jersey, son of the late Henry Sr. and Beatrice Dixon.

He was known to all as "Fred," "Freddy" and "Jack." He attended the Roselle Public Schools and graduated from Abraham Clark High School in Roselle.

Fred entered into the United States Armed Forces on September 10, 1958 where he became a Parachute Jumper (Co B, 1st ABN, BG 325th Infantry, 82nd Airborne Division).

A self-employed mechanic, he operated Shims Auto Repair Shop in Linden and AZ Auto in Elizabeth. He was known as "the best mechanic" throughout the tri-state area.

While living in New Jersey he was member of Mt. Calvary United Church of God, Elizabeth under the leadership of Bishop Samuel McCrae Leak.

Fred was an outgoing and sociable person. He was an avid bowler who enjoyed bowling at Jersey Lanes.

Fredia Beisrel Dixon departed this life on Monday, July 8, 2013 at the age of 74 in Lawrenceville, Georgia where he relocated eight years ago.

He was predeceased by his sister, Beatrice Floyd.
