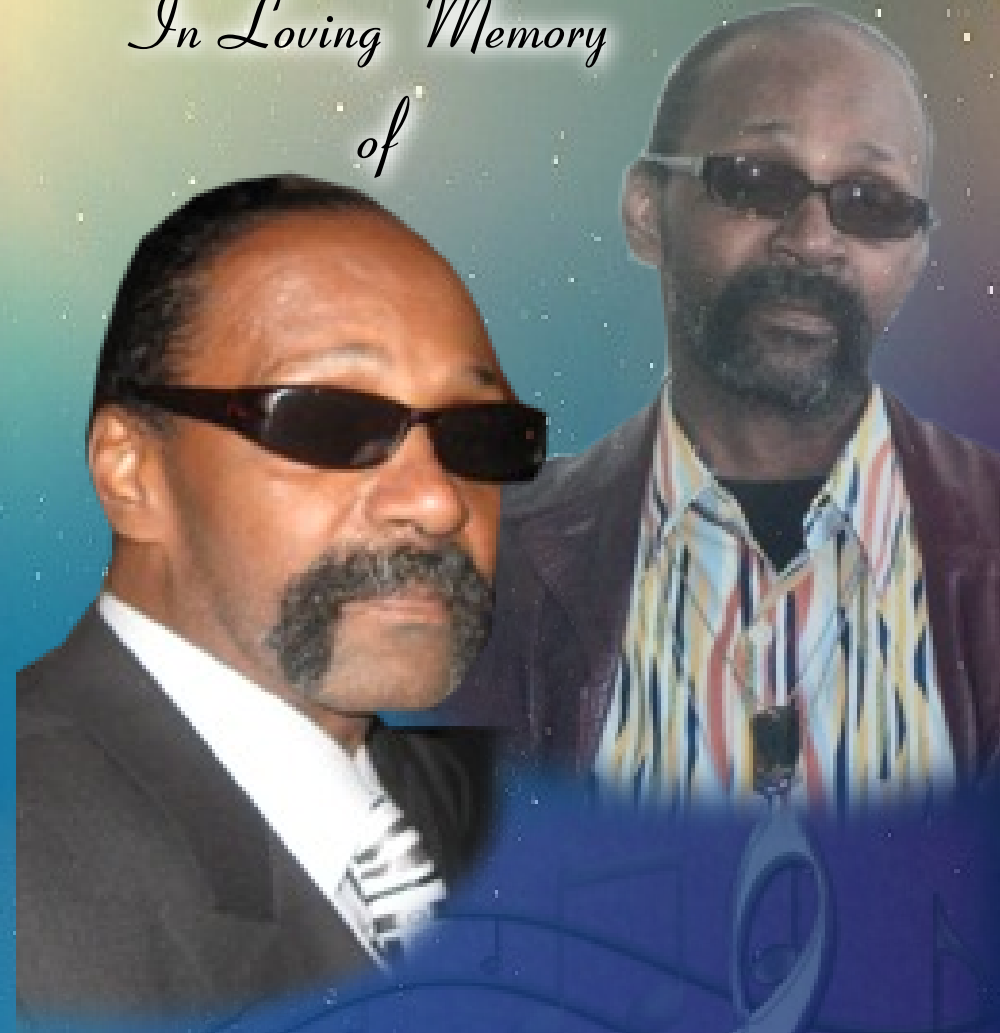

Edward Collins Hearn, Jr., 61, of Newark, NJ, a loving husband and father, departed this life at 1:59 am, Wednesday, July 17, 2013 at St. Michael's Medical Center in Newark, NJ.

He was born September 2, 1951 in Elizabeth, NJ to the late Edward Sr. and the late Arnita Porter.

He met JoAnne Morris in 1972 and they were married June 29, 1985 and she survives.

"Eddie" as he was called by many, worked several jobs since age 14, with the last one being Synfax in Caldwell. He was well known in his community as being "the man with the music". Every Saturday he's get up and blast his array of sounds from the 30s to the present so that everybody in the neighborhood could hear it.

He surrendered His life to God in 2007 while a member of the Liberty Baptist Church of Elizabeth under the leadership of Pastor Anthony W. Wilcots.
