Gearline attended grade school and middle school in South Carolina and Florida. She continued on to graduated from Rosemary High School in SC.

Gearline met and was united in marriage to Willie James Davis on September 25, 1948. From this union she was blessed with six children. Four daughters Radie, Velver and Josephine (who proceeded her in death) and two sons, James and Tommie.
