Pamala Annette Brooks, 69 of Edison, NJ, departed this life on Friday, August 2, 2013. Born and raised in Newark, New Jersey, to Delmar Ligon, Sr. and Edna Ligon. Pamala attended Newark Public Schools and graduated from South Side High School in 1961.
