<u>Obituary for Frances Elbeck</u>

Mrs. Frances (née Manns) Elbeck was born on January 27, 1927 in King and Queen County, Virginia where she attended public schools. Frances moved to New Jersey in 1944. She worked for Blue Ribbon Cleaners in Garwood, New Jersey for two years. Next, she worked at the Westfield Sweet Shop.

Frances joined Bethel Baptist Church in 1945, the same year she met her future husband, the late Henry Elbeck who predeceased her on November 15, 2007. They were married at Bethel on October 19, 1947. They moved to Westfield, New Jersey in 1950. From this union, three children were born: Irvin Preston (deceased 1951), Henry Maurice and Denise Francine. Frances spent the rest of her working life at RCA as a lab technician from 1958 to 1988 when she retired.

Frances volunteered for the United Way and as a recording secretary at Westfield High School. She was an active member of the Bethel Baptist Church belonging to the choir, as an officer in the Sunday School, and as a member of the Women's Fellowship and the Kitchen Committee. She also liked to cook and visit the sick and shut-ins. Hobbies included traveling, crocheting, bowling, flower gardening, reading and playing pinochle.
