Pastor John L. McClain, Sr.



Rev. John Louis McClain, Sr. was born on January 29, 1934 in Mitchell County, Georgia, son of the late Rev. Leonard C. McClain and the late Susie McCarthy McClain.

Rev. John L. McClain was a native of Albany, Georgia and was educated in the public school system of Mitchell County. In

April 1952, Rev. McClain acknowledged his "Calling" to the ministry and in 1953, entered the American Baptist Theology Seminary in Nashville, Tennessee. After completing his Seminary studies, he served as Pastor of the Macedonia Baptist Church in Leary, Georgia and Zion Hope Baptist Church in Warwick, Georgia. In the year 1957, Rev. McClain relocated to Newark, New Jersey and he was called to Pastor Friendship Baptist Church in Asbury Park, New Jersey. In 1961, Rev. McClain was called to Pastor New Jerusalem Baptist Church, Newark, New Jersey until 1964. In 1964, Rev. McClain organized and founded Grace Temple Baptist Church where he remained Pastor and Founder until he was called home to be with his Heavenly Father on August 8, 2013.

Through the years, Pastor McClain graciously provided many outstanding deeds and achieved great success in his endeavors, including assisting many preachers in his pulpit. His favorite songs were: "Deep River" and "A Change Is Going To Come".



Rev. McClain served twelve years as Police Chaplain for the Irvington Police Department until he retired. Rev. McClain also served as Police Chaplain of the Newark Police Department until his death.

On February 2, 1952, Rev. John L. McClain, Sr. married the former Margaret Wooden and from their union, six children were born; daughter, Diane, sons, John L. Jr., Mason C., Leonard C. III, Mitchell L., daughter, Debra A. McClain, who preceded him in death. His sister, Lovetta Pope (William) and brothers, Roy, (Betsy), Samuel, Alton (Betty) and Leonard C. McClain, Jr., Brother-in-law, Arnet Martin also preceded him in death.
