Life Reflections

Mr. David Leroy Snow was born on August 4, 1926 in Morrisville, South Carolina, one of fifteen children born to the late Mr. Melvin Snow and Mrs. Maggie Nesmith Snow. David, affectionately called "Lee" or "Roy" by his family and friends, was educated in the public school system of Williamsburg County, Morrisville.

Upon completion of his education, he enlisted in the United States Army Air Force where he was assigned to the Motor Pool Division.

After receiving an honorable discharge, he met Mildred Nathen Pressley. They were married on January 5, 1949 and lived in Richmond, Virginia for a short period of time before moving to Roselle, New Jersey. Their union was blessed with a son, Vincent and a daughter, Janice. While living in Roselle, David attended and graduated from Lincoln – Gregory Trade School in Linden and was certified in Acetylene Welding. David and Mildred purchased a home in Linden, New Jersey in 1958 where they raised their children. He and Mildred were married until she moved to her home in heaven on February 25, 1997.

David was employed by Posnock Provisions in Linden as a Route Salesman for forty-one years.

His religious journey began at a very young age when he joined the St. John A. M. E. Church in Morrisville, South Carolina. After moving to New Jersey he joined Heard A. M. E. Church where he was a faithful and dedicated member for over sixty years. During his tenure at Heard, David was unquestionably committed to his role as Pastor Steward for the Reverend Theodore R. Goyins until his passing in 2004. In addition to the role of Pastor Steward, David was a founding member of the South Carolina Club and was a member of the Steward Board, the Men's Fellowship, and was a Coordinator of the Heard Food Store. He quietly went about the business of Heard A.M.E. church from day to day and week to week and year to year to make the church run smoothly and was considered to be the "Heard all-around-man." In June 1981, he was selected as Heard "Father of the Year." In September 1984, he was one of the first recipients to be honored at a dinner hosted by the church's Scholarship Committee for dedicated services to the church. In October 1999, he was one of two people individually honored by the entire church at a dinner in recognition of his enthusiasm and hard work.

In 1965 in recognition for heroic action, he was recognized for rescuing a mother and two children from a burning vehicle in Middletown, New Jersey. David also received numerous awards for his various accomplishments, among them an award from the Roselle-Linden Chapter of the NAACP in 1999.

On Friday, August 16, 2013, David Leroy Snow quietly moved to his new home in heaven.

David leaves to cherish his memory, his devoted son, Vincent and wife Dora and daughter, Janice who were faithful to him until he closed his eyes in death; three sisters: Mrs. Corabell Pushia of Andrews, SC, Mrs. Lillie Swinton of Kansas City, MO and Mrs. Geneva Green of Georgetown, SC; a brother, T. M. Snow of Morrisville, SC. He was the adoring grandfather to Stephen, Amira and Vincent, Jr. and great-grandfather to Sierra, Avery and Lyric. He is also survived by his son-in-law, Mr. John Richardson of Edison, NJ and two sisters-in-law: Mrs. Willie Mae Pressley of Linden, NJ and Mrs. Mary P. Brown of Orangeburg, SC, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and the Heard A. M. E. Church family and many friends.

We have loved Dad, Pop, Grand-pa, uncle and friend. We are thankful that God loaned him to us for eighty-seven years and we surrender him with much love.
