

## <u>Obituary</u>

**Edward B. Mayes** was born May 1, 1913 to James "Sam" Mayes and Dafney Davis in Charleston, South Carolina, where he received his early education. His two brothers preceded him. In his youth he migrated to Philadelphia Pennsylvania and in 1939, moved to New York City.

His church life started at Salem under the late Rev. F.A. Cullen's ministry where he met and married Mattie Holmes (who preceded him) in 1942, a union which lasted for over fifty years. He became a active member of the Lyceum Choir, The Junior Usher Board and a member of the (Faith Club) Class 17.

Mr. Mayes served as a Cub Scout Master of Salem Pack 771 from 1954 to 1991. Under his leadership scouting activities were active including participation in parades, hikes, outings, and the establishment of the Little League Baseball Teams that not only included Scouts, but children from the community. Mr. Mayes was the recipient of the Scouting Silver Beaver Award for distinguish service to youth and numerous Meritorious Awards for outstanding service to his church, family life, and community. His community activities included involvement in the St. Nicholas Housing Tenants Patrol where he served as Building Captain. He remained active in St. Nicholas Senior Citizens Center up until his passing. Mr. Mayes is Past Master of Prince Hall Mason Hiram #4 and continued active involvement in Samson Lodge #65 and the Widows Son #1.

Mr. Mayes retired from Pennsylvania Central Railroad and the United States Post Office. He continued his lifelong passion of cooking, traveling and music. Sunday family dinners continued until his passing. Mr. Mayes was a loving father and grandfather.
