She passed her love for good cooking and music to her daughters, and her granddaughters Devona and Amber L., keeping a tradition of birthdays and holidays alive with her own spin of recipes, witty banter, and love. She never shied away from those in need and whatever she had, she was willing to give selflessly to others. Sacrificing even down to her finery for another in need, or if someone was hungry she didn't budge from the kitchen without sharing some food. She was loving yet tough, even tough enough to quote the bible often to keep it in mind of her children and laid down the rules of how to govern your life though them.

She attended Bethsaida Baptist Church in Newark on Bloomfield Avenue. She proved how tough she could be by beating cancer once in 2000 and again in 2008. All the while taking care of her great grandson Rahmeen, when his mother was unable to fulfill the position. Louise lived a full life, yet was taken from us too soon.

She died on August 19, 2013 after complications from pneumonia put her in the hospital for two weeks.
