<u>Obituary</u>

Verner Victor Henry was born on August 15, 1914 in Belleville, New Jersey to the late James Earl and Bessie Moore Henry.

After attending Belleville Public Schools, he graduated from Morgan State College in Baltimore, Maryland and later received a master's degree in Public Administration from New York University.

Mr. Henry worked for the NJ State Government for thirty-four years where he was a District Parole Supervisor. He was the first employee of the Bureau of Parole to be appointed an Associate Member of the NJ State Parole Board. His career encompassed service with the US Senate Committee on Juvenile Delinquency, the NJ Legislature on Crime and Delinquency and the Model Cities Program in Northern New Jersey. Her was the first African American to be elected president of the Newark Board of Education in July 1962. Verner was an adjunct instructor at Rutgers University, a lifelong member of St. John's Methodist Church in Newark, a member of the Newark Branch of the NAACP Executive Board and a lifetime member of the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity. Mr. Henry was an avid train rider and loved his model trains.

He was preceded in death by his wife of fifty-seven years, Cordella Owens Henry.

Verner leaves to cherish his memory: a daughter, Lynn Tyler; two grandchildren, Jeffrey and Lisa Tyler; and a host of other relatives and friends.
