Obituary

Frank Cox, 87, of Irvington, New Jersey was born to the late Frances William and Mahlon Wesley Cox on May 10th 1926 in Newark, New Jersey.

He was early educated in the Newark School system, where he then graduated from Barringer High School in 1944.

In 1952, Frank achieved the honor of becoming a U.S. Marine where he boxed and went on to become a decorated war hero, serving his country with distinction during the Korean War. After the war Frank met and married his loving wife Agnes. They were blessed with six loving children.

Frank was the epitome of a family man and would rejoice at family gatherings. He was a kind and gentle soul who would help anyone in need.
