At a young age she met and married Robert Thomas. Yes she was Ethel Thomas-Thomas. Two daughters, Barbara (deceased) and Yvonne were born out of their union.

Ethel moved to 144th Street, where many of the children on the block shared the small apartment along with her and her two daughters. Once the children were there, they never wanted to leave. Children of all ages always found their way to 117 West 144th Street #2E and she never mined their presence. Ethel was a natural caregiver all the way to the end.

Ethel raised her youngest daughter, Adrienne along with her grandchildren, Kevin, Pam and Roger. In the early 1970's, she went to work at the Madison Square Garden Club, which she enjoyed immensely. Each and everyday that she went to work she walked with her head up and dressed to the hilt.

In 1981, she married Clarence Scroggins. Poppa (as she called him) and Ethel were a real live comedy team until his death in July 2005.

Her health began to fail in 2011, but she still remained talkative, vibrant and entertaining.

On May 16, 2013, she turned ninety years old. She said that she thought that she would never make it, but she beat the odds.

At 5:40 p.m. on September 5, 2013, Ethel took her final breath at Mt. Sinai Hospital.
