

On a steamy day, August 5, 1961, **Bonita Celeste Spence** was born to Arline and Archie Spence. Little did the mother and father know then, that this little life would grow up and touch the lives of hundreds of thousands of people around the world. But touch them she did. In a span of just fifty-two years, Bonita was able to touch the hearts of many with her wisdom and generosity of spirit.

Bonita's Christian education began at Asbury United Methodist Church where she was nurtured in Sunday School, Youth Fellowship, Youth Choir and in the Asburyans Gospel Choir. She accepted Christ for herself at age fourteen. These years defined who she would become; however, the greatest effect on her was the gospel message she learned while singing in the Asburyans Gospel Choir. A gospel song by Rev. James Cleveland was one of her favorite songs and brought her comfort throughout her life. In essence, the song simply says, "yes there will be trials, but even in the midst of trials I can still find a song to sing."

Much to her mother's consternation, our Bonita was not a girlie girl, but more of a strong athlete, out-running, out-bicycling, and even out-dunking all of her male counterparts. All of these outdoorsy things she loved, but the love of basketball stole her heart. In junior high she excelled in basketball, as well as in high school where she was second team all state star, Atlantic City 1000 point scorer, led the team in assists and steals, was listed in Who's Who Among High School Students, and won a full scholarship to Monmouth College. Atlantic City High School's Girls Basketball Program prepared her so she could play on the collegiate level at Monmouth College where she was a point guard and in 1982 set the school's assist record, a mark that still stands today! While at Monmouth, she led Monmouth to compete in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the school's history. In addition, she was voted Metropolitan Athlete of the Year. She then matriculated at Montclair State College where she graduated with a degree in Criminal Justice. After which she became a graduate assistant. During 1984-1985, she coached Plainfield High

School's girls basketball team. Thereafter, she commenced her career as an Investigator for the New Jersey Office of the Public Defender in Newark, where she remained for over twenty-five years. While serving as a referee at the high school level, she honed her referee skills, becoming an NCAA referee, a career she held for twenty-seven years. In 1993, she became the first woman to referee in the US Basketball League. She also distinguished herself by refereeing in the WNBA from 1999-2009. She served in every NCAA tournament since 2000 and two Final Four Tournaments, 2001 and 2005. She worked for the Big East, Atlantic Coast Conference, Big Ten and Southeastern Conference, to name a few.



Bonita's careers are a testament to her tenacity, intelligence and character. Her accomplishments stand as encouragement for young women who aspire to achieve. She became a wonderful woman who generously shared herself with anyone in need.

In her lifetime, Bonita had great loves: GOD, her family, her friends and basketball. She was faithful to all of them, until her death.

She leaves to cherish her memory: her daughter, Leslie Celeste Sekou; her sister friends, Torkwase Sekou and Pamela Jackson; her closest confidants, Michelle Grazel, Violet Palmer and Denise Brooks; her grandmother, Mrs. Deshields; her father, Archie Spence, Sr. (Barbara); her sister, Cathy Woody-Rabb; her aunts, Mary Dobson and Rev. Alma Y. Dobson who helped raise her along with her children; cousins, Andrea Bryant (Michael), Sherryl Blackwell, Major Byron Dobson (Cornelia) and Artie Dobson; and a host of uncles, aunts, cousins and friends. She was preceded in death by her mother, Archie Spence, Jr.

## My Dearest Nene


My Dearest Nene, you will always be
