<u>Obituary</u>

Joseph C. Reed, Sr., was born on July 24, 1932 in Amelia County, Virginia. He lived a long life of service, and Christian fellowship. As a member of the Shiloh Baptist Church in Newark, New Jersey, Joseph served for many years on the usher board. He was also a member of Sons of Joseph Lodge No.1 of the Garden State Grand Lodge of Irvington, New Jersey.

Not the least of Joseph's accomplishments was his eight years of service in the United States Armed Forces. Receiving an honorable discharge in 1960, he held this chapter of his life in high regard, often telling stories so vividly that others said that he should have written a book. Sharing these stories and his wisdom are fond memories that will live on with his family and friends.

Choosing to continue service as a civilian, Joseph worked for a number of years for the United States Department of Defense, earning many service awards, including the following: Military Traffic Management Command, Outstanding Government Service Department of the Army, Official Commendation for Outstanding and Sustained Superior Performance A skilled brick mason and painter, Joseph lent his talents to many large projects including the construction of houses in his native state of Virginia.

Among those who mourn Joseph's passing are: his wife Vanessa Reed of East Orange, NJ; three sons, Joseph Reed, Jr. of East Orange, NJ, Kevin Reed of Harlem, New York, Derrick Reed of Ohio; a daughter, Donna Haskins of Farmville, VA, neice and nephews, Yolanda, Edward and Craig Coles of Newark, NJ; his sister, Cora Reed and brother, Henry Reed of Farmville, VA, sister-in-law, Hattie Van Romondt of Rice, VA; three grandchildren, Dianna, La Shaunda and Iyesha Haskins and two great-grandchildren, Jamira Haskins and Jay Shawn Graine, all residing in Virgina, and a host of other nieces and nephews and cousins. Joseph was pre-deceased by his brother, Percell Van Romondt.

Joseph will also be mourned and greatly missed by Virginia and Louis Lott who were his generous care givers, for whom the family is most eternally grateful.
