

# **Obituary**

So very long ago, two young, wonderful people from near and far came to worship in Mt. Sinai Church. It was there that they first met - Lorester Ashby and Marjorie Humphries. Although they both are now departed, this fateful encounter eventually led to a marriage union that lasted sixty-five years and it was from this union that their first son, came forth.

Howard Ashby was born on May 29, 1942 in Newark, NJ. He was the first of the six Ashby brothers, David, Wayne, Rodney, Jay and Dean. In his early years Howard was an outstanding athlete. With his left handed deftness, he easily outperformed his pals, his brothers, and his classmates in all sports. When teams were chosen, he was always the first one to be picked. He played basketball, football and was especially skilled on the baseball diamond. He was an avid baseball fan. Even after all these years, he still possessed his favorite baseball glove and ball which he stored in his dresser.

Howard attended South Eight Street School. From there he continued onto Irvington Technical High School from which he graduated in 1960. After graduating, he worked as a machinist for a small tool and die company in Newark. He also posed a strong love and passion for reading the daily newspaper. For Howard, getting his newspaper was a near obsession. "Howie" (as he was affectionately called by all his friends and family) also loved Jazz music. He acquired a very large Jazz collection. He would listened to his favorite Jazz artist long into the night.

After high school and for reasons unknown, Howie entered a long period in his life which was marked with depression and withdrawal. In spite of these dark years, Howie was always quick to offer and return a friendly smile.

Howard leaves to mourn his passing his five brothers, two sisters-in-law, Brenda and Francella Ashby; and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
