**Loree D.** (**Drakeford**) **Robinson** was born in Camden, SC on June 6, 1934 to the late Will and Leila Drakeford. She was educated in the Kershaw County Public School System, received her bachelor's degree from Morris College in Sumter, SC and earned her master's degree from Jersey City University in Jersey City, NJ. She was baptized at an early age at the Parker Baptist Church in Camden, SC. After graduating from college, she relocated to Passaic, NJ. She united in marriage to her college sweetheart Rev. Dr. Joseph J. Robinson and they settled in Garfield, NJ.

Loree was a dedicated teacher for the Paterson Board of Education until retiring in 1999. During her forty-two years as an educator she taught at the following Paterson Public Schools: 17, 10, 6, 3, and 12 with dedicated staff and administrators. She had a reputation among her students and was known as the "Lollipop" or "Grandma Teacher". Mrs. Robinson had instilled in the children the importance of doing their best and getting good grades. Former students would always express their gratitude to Mrs. Robinson for the impact her teaching made on their lives. A portrait of Mrs. Robinson should be placed in Webster's Dictionary beside the words: caring, compassionate, giving and loving.

Mrs. Robinson was a member of the Interdenominational United Ministers Wives & Widows of Paterson & Vicinity, The New Jersey Ministers Wives & Widows, and the International Ministers Wives & Widows. At the time of her departure, Mrs. Robinson was a member of the Calvary Baptist Church of North Jersey at Garfield under the leadership of her beloved Pastor and nephew, Rev. Dr. Calvin McKinney. It was such a joy for her to return back to her first church, Calvary Baptist, where her husband served as Pastor for fifteen years. On Sunday, April 29, 2012, she was recognized, along with twenty-five other faithful members as one of Calvary's Seasoned Saints. She had been a member of the Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Paterson where her husband Rev. Dr. Joseph J. Robinson served as Pastor for twenty-nine years until his death in 2008. Sister Robinson loved Calvary Baptist Church of North Jersey at Garfield and Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church. She considered the members of those congregations a permanent part of her family. One of her favorite sayings was, "There are no big I's and little you's." She always had an encouraging word and soothing conversation.
