She loved to travel and food was part of the deal. Her love of family became her passport for children. She brought Arthur's cousins along for the trips with her to New York City, San Francisco, Hawaii the Islands and Canada. Ruth fulfilled her bucket list. She rode shotgun in a Cessna. She flew in a helicopter. She enjoyed cruises. She also had a lead foot when she drove.

Ruthie was "mother" to many however she was Arthur's mother and Arthur shared his mom with others. She was a loving mother with a twinkle in her eye. On one occasion when Arthur asked for grapes, she responded by asking if he wanted her to peel them also.
