

## **Obituary**

Etta Agnes Hill Banks, was born August 20, 1935 in Southern Pines, North

Carolina. She was the twelfth (12<sup>th</sup>) child of the late Howard and Etta Frazier Hill. Etta was preceded in death by brothers, Howard (*Billy*), Joseph (*Joe*), Clyde (*Skeet*), Allen (*Puttee*), Frazier (*Ninna*), Milton (*Bud*), Earl, and Richard. Her husband of thirty-five years, Gilbert Banks, died in 2006.

Etta was a "cradle Catholic" and graduated from Our Lady of Victory Catholic School and attended West Southern Pines High School. She received her General Education Diploma from the State of New York and an Associate Degree in social work from New York Community College.

As a young woman, Etta relocated to New York City where she worked and raised her family. After retiring in 2003 from New York City Agency of Social Work, ACS Department, Etta kept busy extending a kind and helping hand to not only her family and friends but also to others in the community. Her community activities included, membership in the Grandparents Around the World Productions, Inc., the Northwest Bronx Community Alliance, and the Clergy Coalition. She was an active participant in Local 371 and DC 37 Unions. Etta was a member of the Social Organization, "The Hicks and Slicks." She took advantage of opportunities to enjoy leisure activities with family members and friends, especially over-night camping trips. Her active participation was a true reflection of her zeal for live and travel.

Etta had many nicknames: As a child she was called by her mother the endearing name "Sukie." It was a name no family member or friend rarely ever used as if it was reserved only for her mother. Etta's children, family members and close friends called her Lee-Etta, Lee Ala, Lil-Etta, Little Etta or simply, Etta. To her grandchildren, she was simply Nana. She loved it!

Etta was kind, generous, energetic, intelligent and dependable. She enjoyed being with her family, friends and neighbors. She was a phenomenal woman and those whose lives she touched were blessed by her boundless love and goodwill. She was very compassionate and extended her kindness to family and many friends; if you did not have a place to stay, she always extended a cot or a bed to lay your head. If you no longer had a mother, she would adopt you. After all, she was a New York City Social Worker for many years.

Etta passed away peacefully while sleeping, Saturday, November 9, 2013 surrounded by loved ones.
