Obituary



Maceo Johnson was known to many by various names: “G.Q.”, “Mace”, “Maceo”, “Cowboy”, “Boo-Boo”, “The Mayor of White Plains.” He was the first born to Clemm and Hattie in Horry County, South Carolina on April 29, 1938.

Mace’s family moved to New York when he was a child. His family regularly attended Grace Gospel Church in the Bronx.

In 1957, Maceo graduated from New York Vocational High School. His first jobs were at Bronx State Hospital, and Rockland State Hospital.

Maceo Johnson proudly retired as a General Motors Tarrytown, supervisor after twenty-five years. The U.A.W. President, Donald C. Martino Local 664 and the C.P.C. Plant Manager, Don Ableson, presented Mace with an award for his Teamwork, Dedication, and Quality Control during the production of: the Chevrolet Lumina, Oldsmobile Silhouettes, and the Pontiac Transport.

The “Mayor of White Plains” is also a father figure to numerous children, and young adults. He was a strong Community Activist. The Bronx Justice Department gave him a service award for Jury Duty. Maceo spearheaded several family day and neighborhood celebrations which included: Bus Rides to Atlantic City, shopping trips, block parties, birthday parties, family reunions and cook-outs.

Mace has gone home to his family and friends, that have preceded him in death; his mom, Hattie and dad, Clem, his grandfather, Hesikia and grandmother, Elizabeth, his brother, Carl, his cousin, E.V., His uncles, “Q.B.” And Linue and his friends, “Steel”, “T-Bone” and “Bubbie.”

Maceo is survived by his brother, Corneilus; his ex-wife, Agnes; his four daughters, Terriene, the twins; Kathleen and Katherine, Iantha and their families. He also leaves behind twelve grandchildren; ten great grandchildren; and a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

“Maceo” was a unique, strong willed, individual. He will be missed by kids and adults of all ages!
