**Earl Sydney DeSilvia**, was born April 5, 1933 in Harlem, New York. He departed this life on December 11, 2013. He was born to the late Sydney Earl DeSilvia and Mamie DeSilvia.

Earl received his formal education in Harlem, New York. He attended Haaren High School. Earl enlisted in the Army in 1951 and received an honorable discharge in 1954 as a Corporal. During basic training he excelled in infantry activities and became an expert in weapons training. He also was stationed in Germany, and became fluent in 7 different languages.

At the age of 11 after Bible Studies at Refuge Temple, his mother Mamie and Pastor Lawson tarried in prayer with Earl at which time he received the Holy Ghost. As time went on, Pastor Lawson observed Earl and said, "He Must Preach." In 1956, he became an ordained minister. He was a Pastor at Church of God In Christ in Brooklyn, NY for many years. In addition, Earl learned how to play the piano by ear. He played for many churches throughout the Tri-State Area.

In 1971, Earl wedded Claudette T. DeSilvia. This union brought about Xavier, Cachaun, Step-daughter, Bridgette Pierre and Sage who had been deceased since 1974.

Earl held several jobs. He was a radio host in Mississippi, WWRL, WLIR, WHBI, and also was featured on Leola Brown record, "Never Turn Back." Plus, he was featured in Patricia's My Time video, "Could You Be Loved". He was an Auxiliary Cop for several years in Manhattan. Also, he worked for Chase Bank on Wall Street which was formally called Chemical Bank for 29 years.

He was an all-around athlete and former member of the Salem-Crescent Boxing Club of Harlem and was in the Golden Gloves. He had a love for basketball making 25 points a game. He was very competitive and played in tournaments. For several years, Earl coached basketball at Madison Square Garden, Boys and Girls Club at Beach 40th Street. He encouraged the children in the neighborhood to do good. He was involved in improving the recreational facilities for the children and at his request, improvements were made thru the community board.

In his later years, Earl continued to Minister in the Tri State Area. He served as a Chaplain in St. John's Episcopal Hospital and Peninsula Hospital in Far Rockaway, NY. He loved the Lord and fulfilled his assignment to the end. He was known for his favorite quotes" It's Hear", "Weeping May Endure for a Night but Joy Comes in the Morning"
