Reflections of Life

Our beloved **Reginald Lavon Terry, Jr.**, affectionately called "Reggie", "Mu-Mu", "Wink", and "Goose", among our family, was born in Newark on June 25, 1995, to Reginald and Leandra Terry. Unfortunately, at the age of eighteen, he died tragically in Newark on Saturday, December 21, 2013.

During Reggie's younger years, he attended elementary school both in Irvington and in Newark. He graduated from University High School, a magnet school, in June 2013.

Since his early childhood he was a member of The Maranatha Church of the Harvest.

Reggie's love of sports developed at an early age. He participated in Pop Warner Football, Intramural Basketball, and Bowling. He also became interested in being a DJ which he did at times with his Dad; he was known as "DJ Skillz". While attending University High School, he played Football for Central High School and was called "Goose" by his teammates, a name adopted from his uncle Keith. He was named Blue Devil of the Year 2012-2013. He became a member of University's Bowling Team and was named Captain, receiving MVP Honors in 2012 & 2013.

Just days before his untimely death, Reggie had completed his first semester as a Freshman, pursuing a degree in Computer Science at New Jersey City University. While attending college full time he also worked two jobs. And, as if his schedule wasn't busy enough, Reggie received good news about him getting the job he interviewed for at FedEx, which he was scheduled

to start January 2, 2014. Reggie was a young man with a vision; and he was well on his way to fulfilling his vision.

Reggie has touched many hearts and impacted many lives; he lit up a room with his contagious smile; he was a kind, sweet and gentle soul who did not partake in the violent activities that took him away from us.
