Mary L. Richardson was born in Mecklenburg, NC January 12, 1932 Seabrom Ways and Eva Mae Elder.

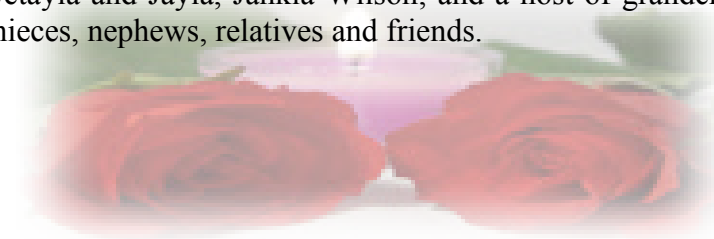
She made a migrated to Englewood, NJ and later to Newark, NJ.
