Obituary

Rev. Thomasena K. Woodward affectionately known as Rev. Tommye was born on September 25, 1932 in Georgetown, South Carolina. She was the second born child of the late Robert Keith, Sr. and the former Annie Dukes. Five children (3 boys and 2 girls) were born to the union of her parents including James (deceased), Robert Jr., Joan (deceased) and Phillip.

At an early age Rev. Tommye joined Bethel AME Church and was a member of the Allen Stars Sunday School, ACE league and the youth choir. She was a member of the 1951 graduating class of Howard High School, Georgetown, SC. She graduated from South Carolina State College with a Bachelor's degree in Education in 1956.

Rev. Tommye began her teaching career in Georgetown, SC in 1956, where she taught for 3 years. In 1959, she moved to Newark, NJ, and taught at Charlton Elementary School. In 1961, she began teaching in Paterson, NJ where she would teach for a total of 37 years with 30 years at school #12 and 7 years at school #8. She retired from the Paterson Board of Education in June, 1995.

Rev. Tommye met the love of her life, William (Billy) Woodward while he was serving in the US Army and visiting his mother in Georgetown, SC. They were united in holy matrimony on November 29, 1958, in Georgetown, SC. Their marriage was blessed with a son, William K. Woodward her "one child" who was born in 1968. Over the years Tommye and Billy enjoyed their family and friends and often hosted social events. They made sure they traveled back to their roots with annual trips to Georgetown, SC with many members of the family. Their union lasted for 35 years until the passing of Billy in 1993.

The Woodward family has been associated with St. James AME Church since 1935. Upon her marriage she became a member of the church. Under the leadership of Rev. Dr. William Wately she was involved with the following Ministries: the Usher Board, Steward Board, Lay President, Conference Lay Organization, Chaplin at Clara Mass Hospital and Minister of the Sick and Shut In. Rev. Tommye became an Ordained Minister and received her Master's degree in Divinity from Drew University in 2001. In 2009, she was honored by St. James AME Church in recognition of 50 years of membership and in 2010, she was honored by the Precious Gems for her years of service.

Rev. Tommye was associated with Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority Inc., and numerous bowling leagues as she was a semi pro bowler. She traveled the country with her bowling league which included many family and friends. Among her numerous travels with the church, she visited other churches and attended retreats and conferences. Her journey to Africa with the church was an unforgettable gift.

Rev. Thomasena K. Woodward was called home to glory at 9:15 a.m. on Saturday, January 4, 2014, at Horizon Manor, Upper Montclair, NJ. She went home in perfect peace in harmony...sleeping, dreaming...angelic.

She leaves to cherish her memory, her beloved son, William Kelly Woodward, her daughter-in-law, Gabrielle Woodward, her granddaughters, Noelle Woodward age 6, and Rielle Woodward age 3. She also leaves her siblings, her in-laws, her nieces and nephews and a host of other family and friends.
