Kwasi Keita Mendoza, was born on October 16, 1985 to Isidore and Rosamund Mendoza at St. Mary's Hospital in Brooklyn, NY. Kwasi was our first child and was dearly loved and cared for by his parents. As a child Kwasi was well positioned in the family and interacted with his siblings as he grew. He attended public preschool in Brooklyn, then by the age of four the family relocated from Brooklyn, NY to Englewood, NJ in 1989. Kwasi started kindergarten at Quarles School then at Lincoln Elementary/Cleveland Elementary School. After elementary educational development, he then entered the Janis E. Dismus Middle School. During his middle school years he also attended the Jason-Kim Academy to be much more prepared for his high school experience. Kwasi had the distinct privilege to attend The Bergen County Academies in Hackensack, NJ. When Kwasi had settled into the environment, he became a well liked track and field team member, a strong competitor and grew to become a great student and better team member as he was always a team player.
