Griffin Johnson, Jr., was born on September 2, 1922 to the union of Griffin and Louise Johnson in Appling, Georgia.

Griffin was a sargeant in the US Army where he was honorably discharged in 1946. He came to New York City in 1946, where he attended Walker Memorial Church.

New York is where he met and married the love of his life, Mary Charles in 1949. Their union lasted for sixty-four years.

Griffin worked as a Shipping Clerk for forty years with the Rextex Company. He became a member of the Shiloh Baptist Church on February 9, 1962 under the leadership of Rev. Calvin Sampson. Griffin was a layman in the church and was a part of the street ministry until his health issues made him unable to continue.

Griffin was admitted to the Amsterdam Nursing Home on January 9, 2009. Here he was visited by his wife, Mary faithfully everyday. At the nursing home he loved to tease the workers (especially Doris, Ime and Mr. Lewis). He also loved to sing gospel songs. Griffin could be heard bellowing out his favorite song, "This Little Light Of Mine" in the dining room on many occasions. He would also inquire about the whereabouts of his favorite Yankee baseball cap. Griffin remained in the Amsterdam Nursing Home until his passing on January 19, 2014.

He leaves to celebrate his life and memory: his wife, Mary; daughter, Judy; son, David; sisters, Beatrice and Arlene; brothers, Charlie and James; grandchildren, Mercilovidas, Zavier, Rolando, N'Dia and Sheila (predeceased); son-in-law, Rigoberto; daughter-in-law, Dot; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
