We celebrate the homegoing of **Otis Dean Rucker**, affectionately known as **"Dean"**. Otis was truly a phenomenal woman known for her strength. She was wise, beautiful, humble, nurturing, compassionate, understanding, powerful, graceful and persevering.

Otis Dean Rucker was born on June 5, 1920 in Sweetwater, Tennessee to the late Walter James Spencer, Sr. and Vienna Dora Spencer. Otis was baptized at an early age at the Mount Pleasant Baptist Church in Athens, Tennessee. She attended Cook High School in Athens, Tennessee. To make for a better life for her and her siblings Otis relocated to New York City in 1940.

Upon relocating to New York City, Otis obtained employment as a domestic worker. She later worked as a seamstress in the garment district for many years. Because of her nurturing spirit and love for children, Otis faithfully served as a Nanny and Governess for Mr. Robert I. Lipp and his family in Scarsdale, NY for many years until her retirement; and even after her retirement Otis embraced the profound love she continued to receive from the Lipp Family who revered her greatly.

In 1972, Otis met and married the late Oddie Rucker. In 1983, Otis joined the Macedonia Baptist Church to continue her Christian stewardship and would frequently visit other churches. She enjoyed attending special programs in her community until her health began to decline as well.

Otis was the second eldest of five children and was predeceased by three siblings: Frances, Sue and Walter Jr.

Otis leaves to remember her life: one sister, Carolyn Carson-Williams; one niece, Vienna D. Spencer-McPherson and nephew-in-law, David P. McPherson; and a goddaughter, Ms. Helena C. Cooks. She also leaves a host of "great" and "great-great" nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

Devoted to her family and true to her friends, her pleasant smile and gentle ways shall be remembered by all who knew her. For those who knew Otis, know she would smile and say:

Miss Me But Le Me Go

"When I come to the end of the road and the sun has set for me I want no rites in a gloom filled room. Why cry for a soul set free? Miss me a little-but not too long, and not with your head held low. Remember the love that we once shared, Miss me-but let me go. For this is a journey that we all must take, and each must go alone.
