Obituary

Deaconess Blanche Lucille Wills, was born to Harvey Elwood and Carrie Baugh Randolph and reared in Hadensville, Goochland County, Virgina. She attended the Hadensville Elementary School and graduated from Bluestone Harmony High School in Keysville, Virginia.

Mrs. Wills moved to New Jersey as a young adult and lived with her uncle and aunt, William H. and Ophelia Baugh in South Orange, NJ.
