

She was employed as a Head Teacher with the Newark Pre-School Council, Inc. where she taught for 32 years. Lurline loved to teach the little scholars. However, she wrote her last lesson plan in 1993 and retired at the age of 70 years old. She continued to teach and pour into her grandchildren and great grandchildren well after her retirement years.
