

The Legacy of Agatha

We celebrate the life of **Agatha Carr** born in Rockhall St. Andrew, Jamaica on October 22, 1960. She was the third of ten children, Lovell Carr, Merlin Carr, Stanley Carr, Jeanie Carr, Annette Carr, Elaine Carr, Elizabeth Hope, Horace Creary and Omar Creary born to George Carr and Shirley Hibbert. Agatha grew up in a district of Carrhill, Rockhall St. Andrew, Jamaica West Indies. She was a beautiful, healthy and energetic young lady.

In 1964, Agatha attended Rockhall Basic School, and then she attended the Rockhall all-age School, where she successfully passed the common entrance examination for St. Mary's College. However, at that time she met Glenroy Brown who stole her heart and got her total attention. Agatha and Glenroy had four children together.

In 1984, she migrated to the United States of America with Glenroy and her two youngest children, Carl Brown and Tashna Brown. They all lived together in Bronx, New York, where she later gave birth to Delmar Brown. Agatha was a very friendly, loving and kind person. She enjoyed dancing, singing, laughing and making jokes. She also enjoyed going to parties and having a drink or two and she knew how to have a good time. She would dance until her shoes fell off. Even

though she loved to laugh, she was not a push over, her confidence and strength caused her to stand tall always. In moments of adversity she would always manage to put a smile on a person's face. She was a very hard working woman and she enjoyed buying nice things for the ones she loved. Oftentimes she would buy jewelry and matching clothes which she loved. She spoke well of her mother, but hated the name "Agatha". She would oftentimes say "I don't know why my mother gave me this name, I hate it." So she preferred to be called 'Thelma' which she was mostly known by.

In the nineties, Agatha was separated from Glenroy Brown and met Kelvin Daby. She then had her last child, Junior Daby. She then moved to White Plains, New York where she started working as a cook. During that time, she developed Type 2 Diabetes. A couple years later she moved to California to live with her friend and sister Sonia. She would speak so well of Aunt Sonia and how they would go out often. While Agatha was living in California, in 1994 her two eldest daughters, Nensha and Charda moved from Jamaica to the United States. Agatha then left California in order to be with her two daughters. Oh how she loved her children and would boast to her friends of how beautiful they are. As the years went by, Agatha's responsibilities captivated her focus, she began to ignore the seriousness of her diabetes. As time progressed, Agatha's diabetes became worse, in and out of hospitals she fought vigorously to live. Struggling with diabetes, renal failure and high blood pressure, she fought so hard for her dear life. With Agatha's diabetes came other complications which led to her death. Sadly, too soon at the age of 53 Agatha passed at the Jacobi Medical Center at approximately 12:58 pm on the 24th of February. She died from heart failure leaving her six children: Nensha Bassham, Charda Brown, Karl Brown, Tashna Brown, Delmar Brown and Junior Daby as well as eight grandchildren.
