She received a major assist from her mother who personally tailored her dresses from early childhood into adolescence. Everybody who met Aisha loved her, how could you not, asked her husband, Osman, who further queried, "how come all my friends ended up befriending her?" Aisha served on the PTA, primarily as president throughout her daughters education. Most people were under the impression that she was employed by the school.

Additionally she prided herself on being a community activist. In time she would be greatly influenced by Malcolm X, which in turn led her to the Nation of Islam. Ultimately she married her husband and joined the Baital al Quarish Muslim community. Their relationship spanned approximately sixty-five years.

She is survived by: her husband, Osman Karriem; daughter, Hajjah Karriem; mother, Aleta Adams and siblings, Sharon Davis and Duane Adams. Additionally she is survived by a host of nieces/ and nephews, tons of other family and friends.

Aisha had a beautiful mind body and spirit and would give her last to anybody. She will be sorely missed but will live forever in spirit in the hearts and minds of those who loved her.
