Obituary

Genevieve Desiree Hunt, 67 years old, transitioned on Thursday, May 8, 2014, at Duke University Hospital in Durham, North Carolina. She was born on June 30, 1946 in Manhattan, New York to Alvin Leopold Nathaniel Lynch and Mary Alice Lynch.



Genevieve grew up in Queens, New York. She graduated from Jamaica High School in Jamaica, NY in 1964. After high school, she attended La Guardia

Community College and received high honors as an inductee in the Phi Theta Kappa - National Honor Society on March 1, 1985. She was recognized as an outstanding student and selected for the National Dean's List in 1985-1986. An honor, only one half of one percent of U.S. College students receive. She remained on La Guardia's Dean's List every quarter of her educational career. She also received the coveted award of "Who's Who Among Students In American Junior Colleges" in 1986. She graduated from La Guardia, with a 3.89 GPA, receiving her Associates of Science degree in Occupational Therapy in 1987. She obtained her certification in Occupational Therapy October 17, 1988, and practiced in the Allied Health Profession thereafter.



Genevieve married Carey Everette Hunt December 31, 1964 in Queens, New York. They renewed their vows four years later. They were happily married for fifty years. Genevieve was a member of the Won Buddhist Meditation Temple at Chapel Hill and was actively undertaking language studies in Korean as a aspect of her spiritual studies.



While living in New York, she trained as a Literacy Tutor at the Queens Borough Public Library. She also volunteered at the Girl Scout Council of Greater, NY. She was a volunteer as well, at H&R Block here in Chapel Hill, while there she provided pro-bono income tax return services to senior citizens in her community. Her hobbies included reading avidly, studying Egyptology extensively, having an appreciation of the arts and visiting museums. She loved classical music, fencing, acting classes, and Egyptian art and dance.
