<u>Obituary</u>

Winthrop Kelly, was born on April 12, 1936 weighing 10 lbs. 11.5 oz. to the proud parents of Lilla Mae Brooks-Kelly and Charles H. Kelly at Englewood Hospital, Englewood, NJ. He was a lifelong resident of Englewood. He had seven siblings, Mary Kelly-Joyce, Eugene Kelly, Katherine Kelly-Plummer, Charles Kelly, Jr., Shirley Kelly-Holiday, Alfred Kelly and Lorna Lee.

Winthrop affectionately known as "Boogie" to his friends and family was educated in the Englewood Public School System. He was a dedicated employee with the City of Englewood Department of Public Works (D.P.W.) from 1973 to 1998. He retired after twenty-five years of service. Winthrop was a faithful member of Ebenezer Baptist Church for more than fifty years where he participated in the Male Chorus for forty years until he transitioned into Glory.

He was the longest sitting Worshipful Master of Ebenezer Lodge. He served as Past Deputy Grand Master of Ezekiel Grand Lodge, A.F.A.M., Jersey City, NJ holding the second highest ranking position for Masons in the State of NJ. Mr. Kelly was also a member of the Shriners – Abdullah Temple No. 1, Jersey City, NJ.

Winthrop was a giving man. He volunteered his time during the summer to drive the church van for the summer program. He also spent a great deal of time visiting and running errands for his elder lodge brothers and sisters who were sick and shut in. In his downtime, he loved to spend time at the local Masonic lodges laughing and talking with friends. He was referred to many times as the life of the party.
