Lesley was born on Friday, October 1, 1982 in Orange, New Jersey, the oldest of two children born to David and Jacqueline Clark of East Orange, NJ. Her sparkling eyes and her infectious smile were evident at birth and continued to be her 'signature' throughout her life. Educated in East Orange and South Orange, Lesley was an involved student who participated in various academic and athletic activities in elementary school, paving the way for her memorable involvement at Clifford

J. Scott High School. As a member of the Class of 2000, she played basketball and softball, made life-long friends and learned valuable skills that would later ensure her success at the college of her choice....Lincoln University, PA.

Lesley majored in Elementary Education and, under the guidance of inspiring professors, learned the meaning of giving back to the community and the responsibility that we all have to make others better along the way. Equipped with techniques, strategies and literacy skills, she earned a B.S. from Lincoln University in 2004, along with a sense of purpose and a determination to make a difference. This marked the beginning of an amazing life.

Immediately after graduation, Lesley encountered a life-changing diagnosis. For some this would mark the beginning of the end, but for Lesley, this fortified her determination and propelled her into gear to 'live life to the fullest'. Family, friends, career, travel, culinary arts, party planning, television, sports, music, fashion, and independence were priorities to her...all done with a special flare and focus.

Lesley's career as an Elementary School Teacher began in 2006, when she was hired by the Newark Board of Education and placed at Alexander Street School in Newark, NJ. She taught 5th Grade for five years. Lesley's energy, commitment, love, excitement and overall personality touched the lives of her students in ways that transcended the traditional educational experience. She made believers out of those under her tutelage and showed the school and community that the possibilities are endless. The winning Girls' Basketball Program, prosperous Student Government, entertaining Talent Shows, amazing Father & Daughter Dance, scary Haunted House Fundraiser, hilarious Fun Day, and simply walking down the hallway.... were school activities that took on a new meaning because, Miss Clark was in charge. Lesley was the epitome of a teacher and she demonstrated that anything can be a teachable moment. The students in her class and throughout the school were her 'special medicine' and their growth and success helped sustain her drive to 'live life to the fullest'.

Lesley loved to travel, eat at exotic restaurants, relax in luxurious hotels and attend exciting music venues. There was not a movie that she could not re-enact in perfect detail or a television series that escaped her scrutiny. When it came to food, the requests never ended for her deviled eggs, macaroni and cheese, lasagna, pasta salad, fried chicken, and banana pudding. Though her Party Planning venture never had time to fully launch, many enjoyed the festivities of her trial runs....especially the 5th year Birthday Party for her dog Shelby, Savannah and Seth's Birthday Bashes and her Mom's 60<sup>th</sup>. 'The Goody Bag', as it was to be called, would have featured an extensive 'candy bar'.



Lesley's legacy is one of grace, bravery and beauty. She had a style and personality that made her unforgettable. Her conversations were comical, mesmerizing, animated, thought provoking, sincere, honest and full of life because that was Lesley's primary goal: 'Live life to the fullest!' She didn't let a medical diagnosis define her. She persevered in spite of her reality and showed us all, by example, that you CAN be the master of your fate!

Priceless memories will forever be cherished by: her proud mother and father, Jackie and David; loving brother, David W.; 'big sis,' Victoria Jr.; niece, Savannah; god-son, Seth; faithful dog, Shelby; devoted friends, Tysheria, Chesney, Tanika, Tamara, LaToya and Tasha; and a host of family members and friends.
