

Joanette Hall Keyes, 76, of Linden, N.J. she left her earthly home on Friday, May 23, 2014 in Scotch Plains, N.J.

Joanette was born in Elizabeth, New Jersey to the late James and Thelma Sumner Hall. She attended school in Roselle and graduated from Abraham Clark High School in the class of 1955. Throughout the years following her high school graduation she participated in numerous additional training courses for her personal enhancement. She was a notary public.

Joanette enjoyed a successful thirty-year career with the former New Jersey Bell Telephone Company (Verizon) in the area of cost accounting. At the time of her retirement in 1988, she held the position of Staff Accounting Manager.

Immediately following her retirement, she began a twelve-year career as Manager of Pinewood Hall, a senior citizen housing complex in Roselle. She earned Assisted Housing Manager certification through the New Housing and Mortgage Agency who gave her the highest rating attainable for her management of the building. During her tenure as Manager of Pinewood Hall she was presented with a certificate from the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders for outstanding achievement. She was recognized by the Pinewood Hall Tenants' Association, the Roselle Section of the National Council of Negro Women, Inc., the Roselle Branch of the NAACP as Role Model of the Year and Women of the Year of Heard AME Church in 1995 and 2014. She received certificates of appreciation by two Roselle's Mayors and their council for her work with senior citizens.

She served as a member of the Catholic Community Services Advisory Board for out-patient mental health. She was a former member of the Union County Club of Negro Business and Professional Women who presented her with an appreciation award in 1990. She was a member of the NAACP, the H.G. McCully- Downstate Chapter #81, and Life Member Club of the Telephone Pioneers of America, Roselle AARP Chapter #5293 and a Board Member of For Someone Special Enterprises, Inc. and Rahway Glad Red Hatters.

A life-long member of the Heard A.M.E. Church in Roselle, she served as secretary of the church's Steward Board and the founder and editor of the church's first newsletter, "The Heard Herald." She was founding member and chief executive officer of the church's federally chartered credit union and received a certificate of appreciation for outstanding service to the credit union in 1998. She served as president of the Senior Usher Board. Joanette managed the church's rental properties and was manager of the Heard A.M.E. Caterers. She was a volunteer worker in the church's food pantry. In 1984 she was presented with an award for dedicated service in the church and community. She was honored by the church in 1999 for outstanding service to the church by the church membership. She was also honored in 2006 by the New Jersey Conference lay Organization of the First Episcopal District of the A.M.E. Church.
